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Version History

4.4.2

This is a maintenance upgrade that adds safe in-app updating for legacy corpus databases, improves startup resource handling, and fixes several corpus, search, and interface issues.

New Features

- Recognized legacy raw-file and Word List corpus databases can now be updated to the current format from within AntConc instead of requiring a complete rebuild.
- Legacy database updates run in the background with progress reporting. AntConc creates and retains a numbered backup before making changes, validates the migrated database, and automatically loads a successfully updated corpus in its requested target or reference role.
- Raw legacy corpus updates now generate lexical token positions and build the indexes required by the current database format. Existing Word List data is preserved when upgrading older Word List corpora.

Improvements

- Frozen-app startup is faster and performs less unnecessary file work. Bundled demo corpora are now synchronized individually using per-corpus versions, so unchanged corpora are not recopied at every startup.
- AI resource initialization now uses manifest versions and no longer recursively copies or scans downloaded model files at startup. User-downloaded models and newer online catalogues are preserved.
- OpenAI, Gemini, and Claude model-list caches are now stored in Application Support. Packaged defaults are seeded only when a cache is missing, while lists explicitly updated by the user are retained.
- Quick Corpora now receive sequential names such as `quick_corpus_1.db`, using the next number above the highest existing Quick Corpus number.
- Newly created Quick Corpora can now be assigned immediately as the target or reference corpus even when the Corpus Manager has not previously been opened.
- Download processing chunks have been increased from 1 KB to 1 MB, reducing overhead during large AI model downloads.
- Whisper command construction and bundled binary permission handling have been improved for cross-platform builds.
- The Linux Flatpak runtime has been updated to version 6.10.

Bug Fixes

- Plot advanced searches containing multiple alternative terms now combine all alternatives before calculating document statistics. Overlapping hits are deduplicated while preserving the existing overlay behavior.

- Changing a KWIC sort preset, including switching from right sorting to center sorting, no longer triggers duplicate searches and repeated “Wait for the previous action to finish” warnings.
- The metadata-filter display now follows native light and dark themes correctly on macOS without showing an unwanted underline.
- Corpus indexing no longer attempts to create indexes for columns that are absent from legacy databases. Legacy upgrades now create all applicable current-format indexes before marking the corpus as indexed.
- Malformed, unrecognized, and newer unsupported corpus database versions are handled more safely and are not offered an inappropriate automatic update.
- Development and smoke-test entry points now consistently use the installed Alice demo corpus from the correct per-user Application Support location instead of creating or opening stray `demo.db` or `test.db` files.

4.4.1

This is a minor upgrade with important new support for image/audio/video-linked corpora, Whisper transcription, AI model management improvements, and bug fixes.

New Features

- Image/audio/video (IAV) corpus support has been added. Corpus databases can now store media asset metadata, document-to-media mappings, and timed segment alignments using the new `iav_assets`, `iav_doc_mapping`, and `iav_segments` tables.
- Raw file corpus building can now auto-detect and attach media files to text documents. Text files can be matched with image, audio, and video files by stem, and SRT subtitle files can be converted into text documents with timed media alignment.
- YouTube-backed and local video/audio SRT workflows have been added, including support for sidecar metadata and helper scripts for building IAV-compatible corpora from text, image, audio, video, SRT, and YouTube transcript sources.
- Whisper transcription support has been added for audio-only corpus creation. Audio files can be transcribed through the bundled Whisper runtime and converted into aligned text corpora.
- KWIC results can now expose linked media for compatible corpora. Image, audio, local video, and YouTube media dialogs have been added, along with image gallery support for image-linked corpora.
- Downloadable Whisper models have been added to the AI Model Manager, including English and multilingual model options in several sizes.

Improvements

- Whisper model entries in the AI Model Manager now use clearer display names and include use-case hints in the interface.
- AI model selection and synchronization behavior has been improved, including separate selection handling for local language models and Whisper models.
- AI model display grouping has been improved so language models and Whisper models are shown in clearer sections.
- The bundled local AI runtime has been updated, and bundled runtime resource initialization has been improved for different Windows distribution types.
- Corpus file operation errors now provide clearer feedback.

- Corpus creation and media matching now provide clearer warnings when files cannot be matched or when stems are ambiguous.
- Metadata filtering and document filter integration have been improved across tools, including target/reference role handling and filtered document counts.
- Statistical functions have been refactored to handle zero counts, empty expected values, and invalid contingency tables more safely.
- Search and result generation internals have been updated across KWIC, Plot, File View, Cluster, N-Gram, Collocate, Word List, and Keyword List to work better with filtered/subcorpus workflows and the newer query planning code.

Bug Fixes

- Normalized value display issues in the Plot and Cluster tools were fixed.
- Cluster tool norm range handling now correctly uses the document filter manager and filtered file counts.
- Legacy caching logic that no longer matched the current subcorpus architecture was removed.
- Several word list corpus builder workflows now provide better validation and warning messages for missing, ambiguous, or invalid source files.
- SRT processing and conversion handling have been improved for more reliable transcript text generation.
- Path handling for writable resources, media files, and bundled runtime files has been improved.
- Release packaging scripts and generated release metadata have been updated for the 4.4.1 build flow.

4.4.0

This is a minor upgrade with important new features, performance improvements, and bug fixes.

New Features

- Full regex search has been added for the KWIC, Plot, and File View tools (for compatible corpora).
- AI-assisted search has been extended to the remaining tools.
- Non-token search support has been implemented in the query processor.
- A global metadata filter has been added, with updated metadata handling and query planning support.
- Stoplist/allowlist filtering has been revised, including auto-loading and multi-select support, and a punctuation filter has been added.
- The Wordcloud tool has been upgraded to the new truewordcloud-based pipeline, with improved layout handling and support for copy/save workflows.
- A version update checker has been added.
- A GUI smoke test has been added to improve release stability checks.
- The Help and documentation pages have been substantially revised and expanded.
- App windows are now better sized and arranged on the display.
- A bug causing the Concordancer tool to not run properly is now fixed.
- The AI system prompt setting in the global setting has been removed to avoid confusion with the system prompt settings for the individual tools.

- The corpus manager has now been redesigned to be easier and more intuitive to use.
- A new AI model manager has been added to allow local AI models to be used with AntConc.
- The KWIC and Plot tools have been updated to allow for AI-assisted searches.

Bug Fixes

- Multiple corpus manager bugs have been fixed, including role assignment/opening behavior and related workflow issues.
- Corpus and AI model manager workflows have been improved with clearer deletion warnings, completion/readiness messages, and better handling of active downloads, indexing, and in-use resources.
- A series of database-locking bugs affecting corpus deletion after using tools such as File View, KWIC, Plot, N-Gram, Word List, Keyword List, and Collocate have been fixed.
- Resource persistence/path handling issues (including macOS-specific cases) have been fixed.
- KWIC processing has been refactored to use inner joins (removing the previous buffer dependency), improving robustness and performance.
- N-Gram settings bugs were fixed.
- The update checker was improved so Windows portable builds now download portable updates instead of defaulting to the installer package.
- Wordcloud tool bugs were fixed across rendering and interaction workflows.
- Markdown/help rendering issues were fixed (including font/image sizing and equation rendering).
- The bundled license agreement and installer license text were revised and synchronized, with clearer terms for non-commercial use, one-user licensing, commercial evaluation, seat reassignment, termination, and related agreement clauses.
- One-time license acceptance prompting was added for Windows portable and Linux builds, while preserving the existing installer-based acceptance flows.
- Linux writable-path handling was revised to use per-user application data locations in packaged builds, improving Flatpak compatibility and preventing writable data from being stored in bundled app resources.
- A settings export bug causing errors such as cannot pickle 'classmethod' object was fixed.
- Windows build and release packaging were improved with standardized public artifact naming and more automated build/manifest generation.
- Numerous smaller query-processing, path-handling, and lint-related bugs were fixed across the codebase.

4.3.1

This is a minor upgrade with a few important bug fixes.

Bug Fixes

- New features and bug fixes included in versions 4.2.3 and 4.2.4 were inexplicably not reflected in version 4.3.0 due to GitHub merging problems. All the changes have now been re-introduced.
- When the ChatAI list of default models is updated, the list would turn blank if an API was not supplied. This is now fixed and appropriate warnings are provided.

4.3.0

This is a minor upgrade with new features and bug fixes

New Features

- ChatAI - An integration of Large Language Models (LLMs) with AntConc. This new tool allows you to use results from other AntConc tools as part of a prompt of an LLM.
- Word (.doc) files are now automatically processed (in addition to the already available Word .docx processing)
- Automatic processing of .xhtml files and .epub files has been added.

Bug Fixes

- Sometimes, a corpus marked for deletion would remain in the list until the program was restarted. This is now fixed.

4.2.4

This is a minor upgrade with several minor bug fixes.

Bug Fixes

- The Collocate Tool showed a scaled frequency value for words to the left and right of the node word used for calculating statistics. This is now replaced with a simple total of the occurrences of the word on the left and right of the node word.
- Several useful statistics for calculating effect sizes in the Collocates Tool and Keywords Tool were missing. These have now been added: LogDice, LogRatio, DRF.
- When creating a new corpus, the new corpus would automatically be assigned the current selected corpus type ('target' or 'reference') and be activated. But, at the same time, any existing target or reference corpora would be deactivated even if they did not match the new type. This is now fixed so that a new 'target' corpus won't deactivate the existing 'reference' corpus and a new 'reference' corpus won't deactivate the existing 'target' corpus.
- The help page has been updated to list all the statistical equations used and provide additional information on how to add metadata to corpora and search using this information.

4.2.3

This is a minor upgrade with one important bug fix.

Bug Fixes

- The keywords tool statistics measure in versions 4.2.1 and 4.2.2 ignored the sign of the keyness value causing all positive and negative keywords to be displayed. This is now fixed.

4.2.2

This is a minor upgrade with a few important bug fixes.

Bug Fixes

- Various issues related to working with word list corpora are now fixed. To simplify the interface and avoid confusion, when a word list corpus is used as a target corpus, all search options in the word list and keyword list tools are now disabled and the complete list is always shown regardless of the search options. I might look to allow searching within a word list corpus later.
- The icons used to display the status of corpora in the corpus manager have been slightly rescaled to render better on macOS.
- I received many questions about AntConc 4x not being able to read files that could be read by AntConc 3x. In almost all cases, this is because AntConc 4x is stricter about encodings, refusing to process files that are not encoded in the encoding set in the settings. I have now reluctantly added a Global Settings option to ignore encoding errors of this sort, even though it can potentially lead to errors in the results. The default is still set to show the errors.
- The Word list tool showed normalized values if the raw values were shown regardless of the tool preferences setting. This is now fixed.
- The N-Gram, Word list, and Keyword list tools, when a search was used, the normalized values would be based on the number of search hits rather than the total hits in the whole corpus. This was in some sense a design feature, but many were confused by the results. So, now, the normalized values are with respect to the total hits in the corpus. The number of search hits and total hits are displayed in the summary results at the top of the tool results window (e.g., 3/500 for 3 search hits out of a total of 500 possible hits).
- Users have reported that sometimes they get confused about which type of corpus (target vs reference) will be opened when they click "Open" in the Corpus Manager or double click on a corpus. Now, the "Open" button has been renamed to reflect the type of corpus that will be set ("Open As Target Corpus" vs "Open As Reference Corpus").

4.2.1

This is a minor upgrade with a few bug fixes.

Bug Fixes

- When the Wordcloud Tool mask options were updated with additional types, the new types were not reflected in the main display. This is fixed.
- The main display now shows at a more appropriate size on macOS.
- The Corpus Manager wordlist import function has been modified to allow easier importing of a variety of word list formats (including lists exported from other tools such as the N-Gram Tool).
- In the Collocate, N-Grams, and Word List tools, sometimes a cached set of results would be used instead of updating the results to reflect new changes in the settings. This is fixed.
- In the Collocate tool, generating results for certain windows spans when applied to certain corpora that included odd word entries would cause the program to crash. This is fixed.
- In the Keywords tool, keywords would not be shown if the expected frequency exactly matched the observed frequency, effectively treating such cases as negative keywords. This is a rare case that would not be seen under normal settings.

4.2.0

This is a minor upgrade with new features and bug fixes

New Features

- Major improvements have been made to the startup time. Now, AntConc shows almost immediately and then displays the progress as each individual tool loads.
- In the Corpus Manager, creating corpora from raw files is now around 3x faster.
- In the Corpus Manager, the Corpus Database Library viewer has been updated. Now the status of a corpus is displayed using color coded buttons, which change color depending on how the status is changed by the user. This color-coding reduces the chances of users clicking the buttons (previously displayed as checkboxes next to color coded indicators) to select a corpus.
- In the Corpus Manager, it is now not possible to deselect all default or user corpora in a single click. This reduces the potential for mistakes.
- In the Corpus Manager, the option to directly load and use a corpus database without adding it to the corpus database library has now been removed. This simplifies the interface and reduces the potential for misunderstanding how the interface works.
- In the Corpus Manager, new "Export Library" and "Import Library" options have been added. This allows the entire corpus database library to be backed up and restored after a new version of AntConc has been installed. On Windows systems, previous corpora are not lost when the version is updated, but on macOS and Linux systems, corpora are lost. So, this feature should assist in making an update smoother.
- In the Corpus Manager, AmE06 and BE06 corpora are no longer pre-installed. This greatly saves download times. The corpora are still available through download from the online corpus repository. For demonstration purposes, a simple demo corpus is now included.
- In the Corpus Manager, it is now possible to hide all corpora in the online corpus repository that have not yet been downloaded. This should greatly simplify the Corpus Database Library viewer.
- In the Corpus Manager, a new "Row Processor" option has been added to the Raw Files Corpus Builder to allow each row of an input file to be treated as an individual new corpus text.
- In the Corpus Manager, building a corpus using the Raw Files Corpus Builder is now over three times faster than before due to optimizations to the corpus building engine.
- In the Corpus Manager, a new "Simple Word List" option has been added to the Word List Corpus Builder to allow the creation of a corpus based on a simple word list showing types, type frequencies, and optional range (document frequency) values. The size of the corpus is guessed from a sum of the type frequencies, and the total number of texts in the corpus is guessed from the maximum range (document frequency) value.
- In the Word list tool, you can now generate different types of lists based on a "list type" setting (Type, POS, Headword, and combinations of these) that will collate the results in different ways as appropriate. This feature is linked with the Keyword tool to allow for key POS lists, key Headword (lemma) lists, in addition to the standard key Types (Word) lists.
- In the Keyword list tool, you can now generate different types of lists based on a "list type" setting (Type, POS, Headword, and combinations of these) that will collate the results in different ways as appropriate. This feature is linked with the Word list tool to allow for key POS lists, key Headword (lemma) lists, in addition to the standard key Types (Word) lists.
- In the Wordcloud tool, the Scratchpad option has been moved to the top of the list of appearance options for greater transparency of use when the tool is first selected.
- In the Wordcloud tool, various mask categories have been added making it easier to find a suitable one. Also, the load time is now faster as a result.
- In the Wordcloud tool, the number of color maps have been greatly reduced. This makes it easier to find a suitable color map and also improves the tool load time.

- In the Wordcloud tool, all foreground and background colors can now be set with a transparency (alpha) value.
- A new File menu action and shortcut (CTRL + SHIFT + T) has been added to allow for quick swapping of the target and reference corpora.
- The global Tag Setting has been revised and improved to allow all tools to display results as just types, POS tags, or headwords, or combinations of these. The setting can also be changed for each tool independently.

Bug Fixes

- After changing the "Words", "Case", and "Regex" options in a tool, the interface changes would be reflected in other tool interfaces, but the subsequent results generated in those other tools would still represent the earlier settings. This has now been fixed. Changes to settings in one tool will now properly propagate through all the other tools.
- Standard queries that included a pipe symbol "|" were processed as a regular expression (regex) OR search even when the Regex option was deselected. This is now fixed.
- Queries that included a combination of non-word (i.e., string) and case-sensitive searches would result in no hits. This is now fixed.
- When any of the "Clear" options from the File Menu were selected, the statistics at the top of results window in each tool were left uncleared. This is now fixed.
- In the Wordcloud tool, the color transparency option was not working. This is now fixed.
- When saving tab results, the name of the tool was not shown correctly in the save dialog file name. This is now fixed.

4.1.4

This is a minor upgrade with one bug fix.

Bug Fixes

- A Plot Tool fix introduced in version 4.1.2 inadvertently introduced a bug that caused the overlay feature of the Plot tool to stop working. This is now fixed.

4.1.3

This is a minor upgrade with several bug fixes.

Bug Fixes

- Previous versions of AntConc 4 were quite slow to start. The start up time has now been greatly improved.
- The Wordcloud tool included many color themes and masks that slowed the startup time when loading and were difficult to navigate. These have now been moved into different category folders and a Tool setting was added to decide which to load at runtime, with only the most useful shown as defaults.

4.1.2

This is a minor upgrade with several bug fixes.

Bug Fixes

- The display of the Wordcloud tool was oddly mixed up when dealing with Arabic text. This is now fixed.
- The controllers of many tools were presented in a left-to-right mindset even when dealing with right-to-left languages, such as Arabic text. This is now fixed.
- The scaling of the display of the Plot tool was difficult to control when in the table display mode as it used both the normalized plot width setting and the relative plot width scalar setting. This is now fixed with the relative plot width scalar setting completely determining the width of the plot. The range of values for the relative plot width scalar setting has been adjusted accordingly.
- In the Plot tool, if a search with multiple components (separated by ||) was used or a search list was used, the results for each component of the search would show separately. This could result in multiple rows for the same corpus file. This has now been fixed, with all results for a document being conflated.
- The database entries for the KWIC tool would show column results that span across documents. Although these were hidden in the display, exporting the database could lead to confusion. The database entries now match the display and only shows column values within a document.
- The Collocate and N-Gram tool results could span across documents depending on the settings. This is now fixed.
- The Collocate tool would crash when trying to create results for words that appeared before or after blank or empty lines in a file. This has been fixed.
- The Cluster tool could generate clusters containing blank slot entries if these appeared in the original file. This is now fixed.
- When the corpus was changed, the File view tool was not completely cleared. This is now fixed.
- Although not a bug, it is sometimes possible for results to not update because a database cache is being used. A new status bar entry now shows when the cache is being used. To clear the cache, change one or more of the tool settings and regenerate the results.
- Although not strictly a bug, when results were generated in the KWIC tool and sorted by KWIC pattern frequency, the results were sorted in a case-dependent manner. Now, the KWIC patterns are ordered in a case-dependent or case-independent manner depending on the case search setting.
- Although not strictly a bug, when a hit in the KWIC tool and Plot tool results was clicked, that single hit was shown in the File tool and the stats were updated to show the single hit result (even when more hits might appear in the file). This was confusing. Now, when a hit in the KWIC tool or Plot tool results is clicked, all the hits for that file will be shown in the File tool, the stats for that file will be updated, and the current hit will be highlighted. This function now matches that in AntConc 3x.
- Although not strictly a bug, when a hit in the File tool results was clicked, nothing happened. Now, when a hit in the KWIC tool results is double clicked, the KWIC tool will be opened and a search for that hit will be performed. This function now matches that in AntConc 3x.
- Although not strictly a bug, when the Plot tool was viewed in the table display mode, the sort options were hidden. These are now made available.
- Although not strictly a bug, in the Plot tool, changing the sort options will now immediately activate a refresh of the results regardless of the display mode. Before, the start button would need to be pressed to see the refreshed results.
- Although not strictly a bug, the performance of the File view tool could be slow when viewing very long files. The performance has now been significantly improved by changing the way the data is stored in the database.
- Although not strictly a bug, the Plot table in the database could potentially show the values for the plot lines out of order. These are now always displayed in order.

- Although not strictly a bug, the Wordcloud table default color range value setting (Max-To-Min) showed some of the default scratchpad results with a very light color. This default color range value has been changed to Max-To-0 for a better appearance.
- Although not strictly a bug, only "txt", "pdf", and "docx" could be loaded as corpus files. Now, any file can be potentially loaded as a corpus file, with a warning shown when the file type cannot be processed. To simplify the loading process, default file types can be set in the Global Settings-> Files option. .XML, .HTML, .SRT, and .SUB format files will now be automatically parsed and the text content extracted when the default indexer is used.

4.1.1

This is a minor upgrade with several bug fixes.

Bug Fixes

- The change in code to increase the speed of the Plot tool in version 4.0.11, inadvertently caused the stats at the top of the page to remain at 0. This is now fixed.
- For the KWIC tool, bug fix 3 in version 4.1.0 introduced a 'one-off' error that causes the display to continue to show the first word of the next file in the right-hand context in certain cases. This is now fixed.
- In the Corpus Manager, the font sizing of the token definition settings page would not reflect the current global settings at startup or after changes were made. This is now fixed.
- Although not strictly a bug, several dialog boxes (e.g., the Corpus Manager) did not show a maximize button. I had now added maximize buttons to simplify resizing the dialogs when more screen space is needed.

4.1.0

This is a minor upgrade with new features and bug fixes

New Features

- The Corpus Manager now offers access to an online repository of corpora.
- The Corpus Manager interface has been re-designed to simplify its use and accommodate the online repository feature. Now, all available corpora appear in a tree-like format.
- The Corpus Manager now includes an "Ignore Footer" option (in addition to the other filter options) when creating a corpus from raw files. The new filter can be accessed with the Token Definition settings.
- A new Wordcloud tool has been added as a core tool in the software.
- The advanced search context option now allows for logical OR or AND context searches.
- The Windows installer now includes Arabic and Korean step-by-step instructions.
- The session settings can now be saved and restored automatically via the Global Settings->Restore Settings option
- A new "File name column width" option has been added to the KWIC tool. This prevents long file names from stretching the column too much.

Bug Fixes

- Several bugs in the import, export, and restore settings file menu options that caused several settings to not be correctly stored or retrieved have been fixed.
- Various widget resizing issues have been fixed and scroll areas have been introduced where windows may grow too large depending on the font settings.
- The "Ignore Header" filter in the Corpus Manager->Raw Files Corpus Builder tool has been slightly changed to avoid edge cases of multiple hits through a file being considered as the header and subsequently removed.
- Several buttons throughout the interface have been given the focus after certain actions to allow for a smoother user experience.
- Although not technically a bug, in previous versions, the KWIC tool would show the context around a search word that would span across documents. This has now been fixed.
- Although not technically a bug, if an advanced search involving context words was used, hits would be found even when the context spanned across documents. This has now been fixed.
- Although not technically a bug, several dialog windows appeared without icons or titles. These have now been fixed.

4.0.11

This is a minor upgrade with several bug fixes.

Bug Fixes

- In the Corpus Manager - Reference Corpus tab, no default indexer was set for processing raw files. This is fixed with the default setting matching that of the Target Corpus Tab.
- When target or reference corpora were cleared or switched via the Corpus Manager, the progress bar in the main window would not be reset. This is now fixed.
- When the "Clear Tool", "Clear All Tools", or "Clear All Tools and Files" menu options were selected, the progress bar in the main window would not be reset. This is now fixed.
- After changing the font settings in the Global Settings menu, the fonts used in the Advanced Search dialog and Token Definition dialog would not be updated. These are now fixed.
- After resizing the Corpus Manager dialog, the new size would not be remembered when the dialog was reopened. This is now fixed.
- The "Time taken" displayed in each tool shows the unit of time incorrectly as "ms" (milliseconds). The unit of time now correctly shows as "sec" (seconds).
- The "Time taken" displayed in each tool was calculated based on the time taken for the internal database to return the set of results. This time could sometimes be much shorter than the actual time to display the results on the screen. This has been corrected and the complete time from hitting the "Start" button to the results showing on the screen is recorded.
- Although not strictly a bug, the Plot tool performance was quite slow when the default 'table' view was used. The performance has now been hugely improved, with a speed increase of over 50 times.
- Although not a bug, the Plot tool would only display results for files that included search query hits. Now, a new tool setting display option ("Show files with no hits") has been added that allows the user to see all files regardless of whether or not the file contains hits.
- Although not a bug, the labeling of columns in the Plot tool display was inconsistent with other tools. Now the columns use the term "file" instead of "doc".

- Although not a bug, the "Create 'Quick Corpus'" File menu option has been renamed to "Open Files as 'Quick Corpus'" to avoid confusion.

4.0.10

This is a minor upgrade with several bug fixes.

Bug Fixes

- In the Plot tool, a bug was introduced in version 4.0.7 that caused the overlay feature to stop working correctly. This is now fixed.
- In the Cluster tool, the minimum frequency and range settings were ignored. This is now fixed.
- In the N-Gram tool, setting the Sort Order to "Type" or "Type End" caused the program to crash. This is now fixed.
- In the N-Gram tool, when an open slot setting was used, only the first open slot was listed as a sort option. This is now fixed.
- Although not strictly a bug fix, in the N-Gram tool, the shortcut to see the open slot variants was ALT+DOUBLE CLICK, but this was not easy to activate on macOS keyboards. So, the shortcut has been changed to SHIFT+DOUBLE CLICK. Also, the help page explanation of the short-cut was incorrect. This has been fixed.
- When using the Cluster tool, the cluster information table in the corpus database would not be correctly updated causing the cache to never be used. This is now fixed.

4.0.9

This is a minor upgrade with several bug fixes.

Bug Fixes

- In the Cluster and Collocate tools, the Advanced search options could not be activated with an error showing that no search query was entered. This has now been fixed.
- Changes made to the Advanced search options were not synchronized correctly across all tools. This has now been fixed.
- Although not strictly a bug fix, the Advanced search options were not available for the N-Grams, Word, and Keyword tools. A limited set of Advanced search options have now been added for these tools.
- In some tools, if white space characters (e.g., spaces, tabs) were accidentally typed into the search query box at the beginning and end of queries, they would not be automatically removed before performing a search, causing unexpected results. This has now been fixed.
- Although not strictly a bug fix, several updates have been added to the Help page to reflect recent changes in functionality.

4.0.8

This is a minor upgrade with several bug fixes.

Bug Fixes

- When the KWIC results were saved as text, special HTML characters that were escaped in the display were not correctly unescaped. This is now fixed.

- Several menu shortcuts have been added.

4.0.7

This is a minor upgrade with several bug fixes.

Bug Fixes

- The Plot tool 'jump' feature that allowed the user to click on a line in the plot and jump to the word in the context of the main file stopped working at some point since the initial release. This bug has been fixed.
- The documentation describing how to add multiple search queries in the Advanced Search window was confusing. A clearer explanation has been added.
- On Windows computers, the Installer would offer the user the option of installing AntConc for the "Current User" (recommended) or "All Users". With the "All Users" option, on some computers, this could result in the user not being able to create their own corpora. To address the problem, the "All Users" option has now been removed.
- Although not strictly a bug fix, earlier versions of AntConc 4 removed the ability to filter KWIC results, deleting or keeping selected rows. Now, this feature has been returned.

4.0.6

This is a minor upgrade with several bug fixes.

Bug Fixes

- Although not strictly a bug fix, the word/stop-word feature of AntConc 3.5.9 has now been implemented. It features as a global setting under "Tool Filters". Now, the word/stop feature applies to results shown in the Cluster, N-gram, Collocate, Word, and Keyword tools.
- Although not strictly a bug fix, the hide header, hide non-embedded tags, and hide embedded tags options of AntConc 3.5.9 have now been implemented. They can be accessed in "Token Definition" settings viewer of the Corpus Manager tool when creating corpora from raw files. The "Token Definition" settings viewer interface has been re-designed to reflect the changes. The help file has also been updated to reflect these changes.
- The Frequency(Ref) sort option in the Keywords tool affected the sort order of the Frequency(Tar) column. This has been fixed.
- The "Metatables Tables" label in the Corpus Manager has been corrected to "Metadata Tables"
- A small performance bug related to the way results were displayed has been fixed, meaning that results should appear slightly faster now.

4.0.5

This is a minor upgrade with several bug fixes.

Bug Fixes

- When creating a corpus from a set of files that included files that were blank or could not be read, the corpus indexer would apply the wrong corpus document ids to the remaining files, making them unable to be viewed correctly later. This has been fixed.

- When changing the sort options in the Keywords tool, the software sometimes reported no hits. This has been fixed.
- In various tools, the global floating number precision settings was not properly applied and an accuracy of three decimal places was used. This has been fixed. The display also now shows all floating-point numbers with the same number of decimal places padding zeros where necessary. This allows an easier comparison of numbers across rows.
- In various tools, the alignment of column information was not always standard. This has been fixed and now headers all appear centered, columns containing text are left aligned, and columns containing numbers are right aligned.
- The summary information for in-built corpora sometimes displayed "AmE06" instead of "BE06". This has been fixed.

4.0.4

This is a minor upgrade with several bug fixes.

Bug Fixes

- On macOS, right-clicking in the N-Grams Tool results window to reveal the Open Slot Viewer caused the Tools tabs to become unresponsive after the viewer was closed unless a right-click action somewhere else in the display was clicked. This has been addressed by changing the keyboard shortcut to open the Viewer from "right-click" to "ALT + double-click".
- Right-clicking in the N-Grams Tool results window outside of the table caused the software to crash. This has been addressed with the change in the keyboard shortcut from "right-click" to "ALT + double-click".
- Some information and warning dialogs appeared without an icon and with default font types that on some systems would not match the theme of the software. These issues are now fixed.
- When using the shortcut keys to jump to different tools, they would cease to work if the Plot Tool was selected unless somewhere else in the interface was clicked. This has been fixed.

4.0.3

This is a minor upgrade with several bug fixes.

Bug Fixes

- In the Cluster tool, ordering by "Type" or "TypeEnd" caused the program to crash. This has now been fixed.
- In the Word tool, ordering by "TypeEnd" caused the program to show "No hits", which was a bug. This has now been fixed.
- In the N-Gram tool, if the "open slots" option was selected, the "ttratio" and "entropy" scores were shown for only the first open slot (S1) position regardless of how many positions were potentially available. This has now been fixed. Where values are not applicable, the "None" entry has now been replaced with a blank entry.
- In the N-Gram tool, it was not possible to see the slot variants. This has been fixed so right-clicking on an entry in the "Type" column will now produce a new "Open Slot Viewer" dialog box showing all the variants that can fit in the slots for that entry.

- In the KWIC tool, the central column could sometimes appear very wide if the search word was followed by various non-token/whitespace items. All the columns can now be resized. This fix adds a useful feature that enables the user to greatly expand the column widths to see more of the left and right context. In this case, a horizontal scrollbar will appear that allows the extended left/right context to be easily viewed.
- In the KWIC tool, the “File name” column could sometimes take up a large amount of space. This column could be hidden via the KWIC tool settings, but now a keyboard shortcut has also been added (CTRL/COMMAND + H) that will toggle the view/hidden status of the column.
- When creating a corpus from tagged data, the “simple_word_pos_headword_indexer” would separate all tokens with a single whitespace instead of the non-token items used in the original text. This mostly affected the handling of line breaks, which would be reduced to single spaces. This has now been fixed.
- Across all tools, selecting the “Regex” search option did not properly disable the “Word” search option, which is not used for regex-based searches. This has now been fixed.
- The font type and size for several dialog boxes did not accurately reflect the global setting. This has now been fixed.
- When global and tool settings were changed, only the settings of the current page were applied. This has now been fixed.
- When custom settings were imported, they were not immediately applied and needed to be refreshed by going to the Global settings. This has now been fixed.
- Although not a bug fix, when AntConc starts, the version number is now shown in the bottom right of the main window to allow users to confirm which version of AntConc is running.

4.0.2

This is a minor upgrade with two bug fixes.

Bug Fixes

- When running the N-grams tool, setting the min frequency and min range frequencies above 1 at the same time caused the tool to crash. This has now been fixed.
- The bug fix 1) in 4.0.1 (pre-creating a “user” folder) did not resolve the underlying problem on some macOS computers. The .pkg installer approach on macOS appears to change the ownership and permissions for apps in unpredictable ways causing some users to not be able to launch the app and/or use it without crashes. To address this problem, the macOS version of AntConc will be released as a .dmg from 4.0.2 onwards.

4.0.1

This is a minor upgrade with two bug fixes (one is really a new feature that allows the correct viewing results for right-to-left languages such as Arabic).

Bug Fixes

- On some macOS computers, the security permissions prevent the “user” corpus folder from being created. This problem has now been addressed.
- A new global setting called “Language Direction” has been added. If the “right-to-left” option is chosen, the KWIC display will now reverse the order of columns so that the results will appear correct for languages such as Arabic. Note that the controller labels “1L, 2L, ...” and “1R, 2R, ...” in the KWIC tool remain the same as for left-to-right languages. This will be addressed in a future update.

4.0.0

This is a major upgrade. The code for AntConc (originally written in Perl) has been completely rewritten from the ground up in Python. For a complete understanding of the new version, please read the help file.

Some of the important new features (many more are not listed here):

- All processing is handled in a SQLite database. This means all processing speeds should now scale well. By directly editing the SQLite database, users should be able to add extra data, extra functionality, and tweak or in some cases greatly improve the performance of the system (by adding custom indexes on their corpora). The database tables can be easily saved, allowing the data generated by AntConc to be easily used with other tools. Similarly, database tables created by other tools, can be loaded into AntConc for processing.
- The loading and saving of corpora are now managed through a "corpus manager" tool. Prebuilt corpora stored in SQLite databases can be loaded (as target or reference corpora) or saved directly through the interface. Raw files can also be processed and saved in an SQLite database format through the interface, allowing the data to be portable and rapidly accessed at future times. The "corpus manager" can also be used to load word lists (when full corpora are not available), and associate lemma/group headwords to raw words for later analysis.
- Raw corpus files in the form of plain text (.txt), Word (.docx), and PDF (.pdf) files can be processed directly and converted into a single SQLite database.
- All results are now displayed in a paged format, which can be adjusted to show a small number of results at a time, or all the results in a single page. For very large corpora, paging results in small numbers hugely improves the performance of the software.
- Results for frequency and range are shown in all tools together with normalized values where appropriate. This should lead to easy comparisons of results across corpora.
- The Key-Word-In-Context (KWIC) Concordancer tool, now re-named as "KWIC", can sort concordances alphabetically (the current standard in the field) or more usefully by the frequency of patterns according to the sort parameters. This new display option will be referred to as a "KWIC pattern display" in all future documentation. The table rows can also be easily copied and pasted directly into other tools (e.g., Word/Excel) with the color highlighting intact.
- The Concordance Plot tool (now re-named as "Plot") shows various statistical measures in addition to the existing plot display in a more conventional table format. A purely graphical view of the plot display can also be chosen via the tool menu options. The purely graphical view can be generated very much quicker than the table/plot view and is recommended for plotting results for a large number of files and hits. Plotted results can also be overlaid with new results (in a different color).
- The File View tool (now re-named as "File") is largely unchanged, but results can now be easily copied and pasted directly into other tools (e.g., Word/Excel) with the color highlighting intact.
- The Cluster/N-grams tool has now been split into separate tabs. The Cluster tool now only allows one cluster size to be set (instead of a range of values as in previous versions of the software). Similarly, the N-gram tool now only allows one n-gram size to be set.
- The Collocate is largely the same as in previous versions although performance has been greatly improved.
- The Word List and Keyword List tool are largely the same as in previous versions although, again, performance has been greatly improved. In addition, when searching within the lists, the lists are now filtered to display only the searched items. This feature makes viewing the results substantially easier than in previous versions.

3.5.9

This is a minor upgrade with a single bug fix.

Bug Fixes

- Fixed a bug in the File View tool that caused highlighting and results to be mismatched when the context search option was used. This bug also impacted results when linked from other tools such as the Concordancer.

3.5.8

This is a minor upgrade with several bug fixes.

Bug Fixes

- Fixed the label of the two-level statistic "MI + Log-Likelihood ($p < 0.05$)" to correctly show the p value to be less than 0.05. Originally it suggested $p > 0.05$.
- Re-introduced the display of frequency values of lemma family members in the Word List tool when the lemma option is activated.
- Removed the appearance of irrelevant index data values after file names in the output of the KWIC concordancer tool.

3.5.7

This is a minor upgrade with several bug fixes.

Bug Fixes

- Scroll bars in the Word List tool would only be properly shown if the cursor was momentarily moved into the results window or the scroll bar was directly moved. This is now fixed.
- The Word List tool reported the total number of types and tokens regardless of whether or not a lemma list was used. This is now fixed to properly show the total lemma types when a lemma list is used.
- A bug dating back to the AntConc 3.4.x versions that caused KWIC concordancer results to misalign with those in the File View tool when a search pattern produced results that spanned line breaks has now been fixed.

3.5.6

This is a minor upgrade with several important bug fixes.

Bug Fixes

- A bug introduced in version 3.5.4 caused the loading of lemma lists to print out the lemma in the background dramatically slowing the loading process. This is now fixed.
- A long-time bug that caused the tab embedded files to be rendered incorrectly on Mac OSX has now been fixed. I only became aware of the issue very recently.
- A long-time bug that caused files that had only character returns marking line breaks to load on a single line has now been fixed. Again, I only became aware of the issue very recently.
- The routine to automatically remove BOMs from UTF-8 encoded files has been improved to be more reliable.

- A bug that caused index numbers to appear in the file column of cloned KWIC concordance windows has now been fixed. The index numbers no longer appear.
- A bug that caused the results to be automatically sorted on first generation (regardless of the sort options) has now been fixed. It was also noticed that in version 3.5.x it was not possible to view the result in the order they appeared in the file (because the first sort option was also activated). This has been fixed by allowing all sort levels to be activated and deactivated. When all the sort options are deactivated, the results will be in the order that the hits appear in the files.

3.5.5

This is a minor upgrade with fixes to small but important bugs that affected results in the KWIC concordance tool and were introduced in version 3.5.4.

Bug Fixes

- A bug introduced in version 3.5.4 caused the KWIC concordance window to only show a limited number of characters to the right of the search term and also not show characters that appeared across line boundaries. This is now fixed.
- A bug introduced in version 3.5.4 caused the KWIC concordance window to skip edge case results when the same search term appeared repeatedly close to itself. This is now fixed.

3.5.4

This is a minor upgrade with a single but important bug fix that hugely improves the performance when working with large files.

Bug Fixes

- The new way to calculate KWIC concordance lines introduced in version 3.5.x was inadvertently very slow when dealing with single, very large files. This has now been fixed. However, it has also been noticed that the performance of searches is very slow when the case option is deactivated (the default). Much higher performance can be gained by activating this option. (The performance drop here is related to the handling of Unicode characters). One further way to improve performance (when doing multi-word searches only) is to deactivate the "Treat search whitespace as one or more non-tokens" in the Wildcard global settings. (Again, the performance drop here is related to the handling of Unicode characters).

3.5.3

This is a minor upgrade with a single important bug fix.

Bug Fixes

- The Advanced Search window was not showing up correctly on Macintosh OS X computers. This is now fixed.

3.5.2

This is a minor upgrade with a single important bug fix.

Bug Fixes

- The Word List Tool search function was not showing any highlighted results. This is now fixed.

3.5.1

This is a minor upgrade with a single important bug fix.

Bug Fixes

- The Advanced Search display on Linux was not appearing correctly. This is now fixed.

3.5.0

This is a minor upgrade with various new features and bug fixes.

New Features

- The numbers of rows presented in the Concordance Tool and lines plotted in the Concordance Plot Tool can now be restricted via the "Show Every Nth Row" option.
- Two new statistics are included in the collocates tool preferences. These are "Log-Likelihood" and a two-level statistic "MI + Log-Likelihood ($p < 0.05$)" that combines the "Log-Likelihood" statistical measure at a threshold of $p > 0.05$ with the MI effect-size measure.
- The Concordance Plot tool has been improved to show hit numbers within the plots and also allow the plots to be saved to a postscript file. The postscript file can be easily converted to a PDF file through Adobe Acrobat or a similar tool. In addition, the plot tool can now plot hits in a normalized fashion (as in previous versions) or using a relative length to the length of the file (in characters).
- Shortcuts are now adjusted on Macintosh OS X systems to match normal keys more closely.
- The Word List Tool can now accept a file containing a word list.
- The Keyword List Tool now offers a clearer set of keyword statistic critical values.
- The Keyword List Tool now offers a choice of effect size measure by which to rank the results.
- The Keyword List Tool now offers 4-term Log-Likelihood keyness measure (set as default), which is considered to be the current best practice for Log-Likelihood keyness calculations.
- The Word List Tool and Keyword Tool now use a backend database to do all processing. This speeds up the processing.
- The encoding options now include an Auto-Detect option. This will be very successful at detecting Unicode encodings – e.g., UTF-8, UTF-16LE, UTF-16BE, and recent improvements mean that it also has very good success at detecting many other legacy encodings. The detection engine is the same as that used in the Firefox web browser.

Bug Fixes

- Many spinboxes were set to maximum values of 99 or 100. They are now set at a max value of 999999.
- The zoom function in the plot tool now only expands the plots in the horizontal direction. This allows users to see tightly packed dispersions more easily.
- Deleting lines in the concordance display will now correctly delete the same lines in the plot display.
- Save file menus now correctly report the file type to be used helping the user to select a suitable file more easily.
- Saving of the results in the File Tool produced a blank file. This is now fixed.
- When opting to replace whitespace with a character in the global settings wildcards menu, the result was always to replace whitespace with the number 1. This is now fixed.

- Early dev versions had a bug that caused the Plot Length Options menu to show the normalized length and relative length options as checkboxes instead of radioboxes. These are now fixed.
- Although not strictly a bug, regular expression (regex) searches now use back-references starting with \1 (instead of \2 as in previous versions).

3.4.4

This is a minor upgrade addressing one bug.

Bug Fixes

- When the "Hide tags" or "Hide tags (Search in Conc/Plot/File View)" global setting tag options were selected, the File View would continue to show headers in certain cases, i.e., when the header extended beyond a single line. This would cause the strange effects such as the concordance/concordance plot lines and linking to become out of sync. This has been fixed.

3.4.3

This is a minor upgrade addressing two bugs.

Bug Fixes

- When searching using the "Hide Tags (Search in Conc/Plot/File View)" option in the File View tool, if the target file did not contain both non-embedded and embedded tags, the program would freeze. This is now fixed. I am not sure how long this bug has existed. The problem may have been introduced due to a change in the core programming language, but I cannot be sure.
- The Windows "Delete" and "Insert" shortcut keys on Windows systems are now mapped to the "Delete" and "Shift-Delete" keys on Macintosh OS X systems.

3.4.2

This is a minor upgrade addressing a refresh issue that was noted on Macintosh OS X 10.9 (Mavericks) operating systems.

Bug Fixes

- Due to changes introduced to the graphics rendering on Macintosh OS X 10.9 (Mavericks), AntConc did not refresh correctly after certain actions making the screen look to freeze. The earlier workaround was click outside of the AntConc window and back into the window to force a refresh. This new version of AntConc fixes the problem at the code level and so no refresh issues should be seen in the future. The workaround has involved creating a standard build of the Perl programming language based on Citrus Perl (5.16.0) and the latest Tcl graphics engine. The introduction of the latest versions of these tools may introduce other very small changes in results due to the use of the latest Unicode standard, but these are unlikely to affect normal users.

3.4.1

This is a minor upgrade addressing several issues noted with the release of 3.4.0.

Bug Fixes

- On Macintosh and Linux systems, I have heard reports that the advanced search window sometimes does not appear correctly when the "Advanced Search" button is clicked. To address this, I have set the window size explicitly (instead of calculating the size from the internal widgets) and forced a refresh of the screen. This addresses the problem on the systems that I have checked (Macintosh 10.6.8, 10.7.2 and Linux Mint 10). I hope it fixes the problem on other systems. This is difficult to test so please let me know if you continue to find a problem.
- If no search term is inputted into the search box, an error that "No search term has been entered" is reported even when terms have been entered using a file-based search. This is now fixed.
- In 3.4.0, when the program was first started, the collocates display would incorrectly show the span to be 5L to 5R, when it was in fact 1L to 1R. Although changing the span setting would rectify the problem, on first load, the results would appear to be incorrect. In this new version, the display continues to show the span to be 5L to 5R, but the results now match the setting.
- In all versions of AntConc, the results produced when using context horizons (e.g., in the advanced search of the Concordance tool) are dependent on the window span (e.g., set in the main windows of the Concordance Tool). If the span of the horizons goes beyond the window span, spurious results can be generated. In 3.4.0, due to the nature of results being stored in a set of columns in database, if the left horizon span went beyond the number of columns estimated by the window span, no hits would be reported. In some ways, this was a good thing as it showed that something is wrong with the span settings. However, the results no longer matched those in previous versions of AntConc that simply ignored the mismatch and produced results for the largest horizon span possible. I have now edited the storage routine so that 3.4.1 also ignores the mismatch and creates results for the largest column size possible. I am still unsure if this is best approach to take. I am considering if a proper error or warning should be reported when a mismatch between the context horizon span and the window span arises.
- Although not strictly a bug, due to changes in the way the Clusters/N-Grams tool treated line breaks introduced in 3.4.0, results stopped matching those from earlier versions of AntConc (e.g., 3.3.5). In this version, I have introduced an option in the Clusters/N-Grams preferences to either replace line breaks with a space or other character (as happens with the Concordance Tool - the default) or leave line breaks as is. If line breaks are left as is, the results will match those from previous versions of the software.
- Although not strictly a bug, on startup with a user settings file, AntConc would not remember the size or position of the main window and instead show it at the default size and position. This has been fixed.
- When AntConc is launched on a Windows system with a magnified view (e.g., 125%), some of the settings options were hidden from view. To compensate for this feature of Windows, I have redesigned the settings windows so that all options are viewable when first launched in magnified view at 125%. Viewing at 150% is still likely to hide certain options. I have also allowed the settings windows to be resized so that even at 150%, it should still be possible to resize the settings window to see the options.
- The way the program reads in files has been changed to avoid a strange bug that occurred when reading in some Unicode files that resulted in the last character on a line being misread on very rare occasions. The way file names are displayed in the program has also been changed to avoid a potentially similar problem (although I have heard of no reports on this to date).
- The "Range" heading of cloned Clusters/N-Grams tool results did not show correctly. This has been fixed.
- The "Stat" heading of the cloned Collocates tool results was shown as "Prob". This now appears correctly.

3.4.0

This is a semi-major upgrade fixing a few small bugs and adding several important features to improve the output display of the Concordancer and Plot tools.

New Features

- The Concordancer tool output now correctly centers the search terms regardless of language. This is especially useful for Asian languages such as Japanese, Chinese, and Korean that have two-byte character widths. Note that this is achieved by using two columns in the 'KWIC' pane. If you click CTRL-A in the pane, only one of these hidden columns will be selected. Use ALT-A to select all columns.
- Line breaks in the Concordance Tool output can now be replaced by a user-defined character (default being a single space). Again, this is especially useful for Asian languages because traditional replacement by a single space might inappropriately split words that cross line-break boundaries.
- The Collocates Tool no longer includes the center word in the collocation table. This results in more meaningful collocate values.
- Not exactly a feature, but Concordance Tool searches are now only centered on completion rather than after finding the first line. This is generally a more pleasant experience.
- Whitespace options in the wildcards menu have now been extended.
- A database now runs in the background and is used to store KWIC and Plot concordance results. This alleviates out of memory problems with earlier versions and allows much faster sorting of the KWIC. The new database model also improves the performance of general KWIC and Plot searches.
- In the Advanced Search, if you add multiple context words, AntConc will look for *any* of these in surrounding context of the search term rather than *all* of them (as in earlier versions). This change has been implemented as a result of many requests for this function. I hope it does not inconvenience too many people.
- In the Collocates tool, if you click on a word, it will search for that word in the Concordance Tool but restrict results to only those where the original search term is in the neighborhood of the collocate as set by the Collocates tool. Again, this change has been implemented as a result of many requests for this function.
- Colors for the highlight and ordered words in the KWIC display have been changed to be a little easier to see.
- The font size for the main results is now a little larger.
- Mismatches in results across tools (e.g., different frequency counts for the Concordance, Plot, File View and Clusters/N-grams tools) due to the different ways in which tools handle line breaks and spacing have been fixed. In particular, by changing the default processing to replace line breaks with spaces, the frequencies reported in the Clusters/N-grams tool will now match the Concordance tool hits.
- All searches are now performed to find the maximum number of hits for a particular search. This means that a search for "aa" in a string "aaa" will now produce two hits instead of one (as in earlier versions of AntConc). For most 'word' based searches, very few differences will be noticed. However, results can be quite strikingly different for string-based searches using wildcards. The new way of doing searches is intuitively more sensible than the previous search approach. However, many other software programs adopt the previous approach so you should expect some differences when comparing results.
- Generic line break characters representing line breaks on different systems (e.g., \r\n for Windows and \n for Linux/OS X) are now used for all file processing.

Bug Fixes

- The Collocates Tool sometimes used to report values of "-1" (when the only collocates of the center word was itself) and "-2" (when the collocate value was not able to be calculated due to an out-of-sync word list). The first case ("-1") no longer exists (see feature 3 above). In the second case ("-2"), the value has now been replaced with "0" to avoid confusion.
- In the Word List Tool, Alt-A now correctly selects all the panes including the Lemma list.
- When no corpus file names were selected in the left panel, sometimes the "Close file" menu option would delete the first file name in the list instead of reporting that no file was selected. This has been fixed.
- After changing the size of the Search Entry font option in the global settings, the new font size would not be reflected in the sample display. This is now fixed.
- If the "invert sort" option was activated in any tool with this feature, an "Array XXX" error was produced in the results window. I apologize for this very inconvenient bug.
- Several other minor bugs including one that sometimes led to tags not being hidden properly after applying tag settings have been fixed.

3.3.5

This is a minor upgrade fixing a few small bugs. One very minor new feature has been added.

New Features

- The "Order by Stat" sort option is now set as the default option in the Collocates Tool.

Bug Fixes

- Fixes a problem that caused the window span controller values to become out of sync if the "from" controller changed the "to" controller or vice versa.
- Fixes a problem that caused the window 'same' checkbox controller to not work properly.
- Fixes a problem that caused the scrollbars to not show correctly in the cloned view of the Concordancer Tool window.
- Fixes a problem that caused the background color of the global-settings->character encoding options to appear white on a Mac OS X system. This made the options impossible to read because the OS X native foreground color is also set to white, which is different from that on Windows and Linux computers.

3.3.4

This is a minor upgrade fixing a single bug. No new features have been added.

Bug Fixes

- Sort by word end in the Word List tool produced a list in reverse order. This is now fixed.

3.3.3

This is a minor upgrade fixing a couple of bugs. No new features have been added.

Bug Fixes

- A tab delimiter character incorrectly appeared in the KWIC concordance display. This is now fixed.
- If multi-character delimiters were inputted, the highlighting became misaligned. This is also fixed.
- A bug causing the software to keep reopening after clicking the close button (top right of screen on Windows) was fixed. The problem only appeared after importing user settings files or reloading the default settings.

3.3.2

This is a semi-major upgrade that addresses an important bug in version 3.3.1. I have also added a few small but useful features.

New Features

- Performance has been greatly improved (> 10 times) for all but the Concordance and Plot tools. I hope to improve the performance of these tools from now.
- It is now possible to append user-defined characters to the standard Unicode character classes.
- Users can now choose to ignore or not ignore white space in the search box. The default is set to ignore white space
- Users can now choose which delimiter character to use in the Concordance tool.
- The "treat all data as lowercase" option is now set as default on all tools except the Concordance and Plot tool. I hope this is a much more sensible default setting.
- Files created on different platforms (Windows, OS X, Linux) can have different end-of-line characters. These are now treated correctly regardless of which platform *AntConc* is launched on.

Bug Fixes

- Some user token definitions caused the output to display strange results that appeared to ignore any word boundaries. This problem is now fixed.

3.3.1

This is a minor upgrade that addresses a few small bugs in version 3.3.0.

Bug Fixes

- All windows now resize correctly to show widgets even when the 'screen display' setting on Microsoft Windows is set to 125%. In 3.3.0, an enlarged display caused some setting areas to be cut.
- Windows are now centered correctly regardless of the screen display setting on Microsoft Windows. Also, there is no flicker of windows moving from the top left of the screen to the center as they are positioned.
- The checkbox for Level 1 sorting now includes a greyed-out check mark.
- Underline marks that appeared under list items (e.g., corpus files in the main window) have now been removed.
- A few bold headers have now been corrected to normal typeface.
- Word and case checkbuttons in the main window are now correctly disabled if the Regex option is marked as active in a user settings file.

3.3.0

This is a major upgrade introducing many new features and addressing bugs that appeared in previous 3.2.x versions.

New Features

- Now *AntConc* runs completely natively on all platforms. This is especially important for Macintosh OS X users as it means no X11 installation is required. Also, the interface is considerably improved over previous 3.2.x versions most spectacularly on Macintosh OS X but also on Windows and Linux systems.
- The “range” information for a word has now been added to the Clusters Tool. This allows ‘lexical bundles’ of a certain minimum range to be generated.
- The full path of a corpus file is now shown by hovering the cursor over the file name in the main window.
- Loading of lemma lists is now greatly simplified.
- Loading of reference corpus lists are now greatly simplified.
- When loading reference corpus lists, checks are now made to see if the format is correct.
- The interface has been simplified a little by removing little-used buttons, in particular, the “Reset” button and “Exit” button on each tool tab. Also, the ambiguous “Save Window” button has now been renamed “Close Results” to reflect its action more accurately.
- Hit and frequency counts now appear above the results window in all tools.
- The Clusters tool has now been renamed “Clusters/N-Grams” to reflect its functions more accurately.
- The actions associated with spinbox arrows have now been reversed. This is perhaps a more natural way for them to work.
- The term “Language Encoding” used in 3.2.x versions has now been corrected to “Character Encoding”.
- Various default settings have been changed to reflect modern corpus linguists’ preferences. In particular, the default character encoding has been changed from Latin 1 to UTF-8.
- This user file has now been updated to be a little easier to read and understand.
- After opening or saving files, *AntConc* will now remember the folder location.

Bug Fixes

- Selection highlighting of corpus files now accurately reflects which files can be viewed in the File View tool.
- *AntConc* now correctly remembers the positions of windowpanes after global and tool preferences have been accessed.
- *AntConc* now correctly remembers the last preference window accessed by the user.
- Numerous interface oddities associated with 3.2.x versions of *AntConc* should now be fixed with the introduction of a native interface for all platforms (see New Features 1 above).
- File names with a different character encoding of the file contents will now appear correctly.

3.2.4

This is a minor upgrade fixing two problems (one only applicable to OS X). No new features have been added.

Bug Fixes

- Modified the OS X version so that lemma list files will load correctly regardless of the OS version. The bug was more general and possibly caused errors when using any single file open file dialog box, e.g., importing settings files, search list files, and word list files. I only heard one or two reports of problems on OS X, so perhaps the problem was introduced with upgrades to recent versions of OS X. It is difficult to tell.
- Fixed a bug that caused the total number of lemma entries to not be displayed properly.

3.2.3

This is a major upgrade introducing several new features and addressing bugs that appeared in version 3.2.2.1.

New Features

- Massively simplified the engine used for sorting and displaying results. This will allow for improved performance later.
- Introduced a Concordance preference setting allowing tab spaces to be added around the search hit in the KWIC concordance view. Introducing this means that the toggle shortcut key 'x' to show/hide the KWIC search term has had to be removed. This function can now be accessed via the (fixed) menu option. I also hope to reintroduce this toggle shortcut key later.
- Introduced the option to use word list(s) of reference corpus files instead of directly processing the raw files. This allows fast generation of keywords and also allows users to generate keyword lists even when the reference corpus is not available (but a word list is). See the Keyword List section for further details.
- Introduced feature to output the counts of types and tokens for each tool when saving results as a text file.
- Changed some of the default settings in response to user feedback:
- Concordance Tool sort levels are set as 1R, 2R, 3R.
- The Collocates Tool Stats measure is now displayed and calculated.

Bug Fixes

- The splash screen that appeared when a user settings file was added has been removed. Now, the words "User Settings" appears next to the title of the software at the top of main window, whenever a user settings file is used.
- The layout of the main window has been improved so that the main work area is maximized for all sizes of main window.
- Unicode "Marks" can now be added/removed in the token definition settings
- Occasionally, the last bar of the progress bar remained blank at the end of processing. This has now been fixed.
- Under tag settings, the "Hide Header Tags" option will now work for headers that span across multiple lines.
- The main window and all pop-up windows now appear centered in the display.
- When viewing the global settings preferences, it was possible to accidentally activate the main window by clicking on it. This has been fixed.

- The list of files in the left pane was often too narrow to view easily. This has been fixed by introducing a two-pane approach, with the left pane showing the files, and the right pane showing the results and controls. The width of both panes can be adjusted with the default size being the minimum size.
- It was possible to adjust the main window to be smaller than the default size of 800px by 600px. This caused the positioning of some widgets to become misaligned. Now, 800px by 600px has been set as the minimum size of the main window.
- Various problems experienced when cutting, copying, and pasting text to/from the Search boxes in each tool have been addressed by removing the "Spinbox" widget type and replacing this with a standard "Entry" widget. The history of previous searches can be now accessed using the "Up" (previous) and "Down" (next) arrow keys.
- After moving the cursor over the corpus files list while using the File View Tool, it should change into a "Pointing Finger" cursor. However, this cursor shape was returned incorrectly back to a standard "Edit" cursor when one of the files was selected. This has now been fixed.
- Changed foreground to white when *AntConc* reports that the KWIC analysis has finished or has no results. This should be easier to read.
- Fixed a bug that caused the Concordance preference option "Hide search term in KWIC display" to only show the hit. (The opposite of the stated function!). This is now fixed.
- Fixed some typos in this Read Me document.
- Fixed a major bug that caused a warning to always appear when using the T-Score statistical measure with the Collocates Tool. Note that the warning could be ignored as the results would always be correct.

3.2.2.1

This is a minor upgrade addressing bugs that appeared in version 3.2.2.

Bug Fixes

- The legacy character encodings for Japanese, Chinese, Taiwanese, and Korean were inadvertently left out of the compiled executable for version 3.2.2 meaning that files encoded in these languages would not open correctly in *AntConc*. These have now been added.
- In the Mac OS X version, the compiled version did not include several important components which are essential for the X11 graphical toolkit to run correctly. These have been added.

3.2.2

This is a minor upgrade addressing several minor bugs that appeared in version 3.2.1. It is also the first version of *AntConc* to be compiled with Perl 5.10.

Bug Fixes

- Fixed a bug that caused back references to not work correctly when the 'Regex' search option was selected. This now works correctly. However, note that the first back reference should be 2 and not 1 (due to an implicit back reference 1 that holds the entire search result)
- Fixed error message when the sort by Stat option was selected.

3.2.1

This is a minor upgrade addressing several bugs that appeared in version 3.2.0, as well as introducing a few new features requested by users.

New Features

- Better display of long lists of fonts and font sizes in the global options/font menu. Now the lists appear as an easy to navigate list with attached scrollbar.
- When results windows are saved, the cloned windows now display summary results information.
- Word range lists can now be used as lemma range lists.
- New feature allowing tagged data to be searched while remaining hidden. See the tag settings preferences. Pressing CONTROL and the START button (or the ENTER button if the search entry box has the focus) temporarily disables the new feature, allowing the user to switch easily between a 'non-tagged' or 'tagged' display.
- New options in the tag settings preferences that allow embedded and non-embedded tags to be shown, ignored, or hidden. This enables data of the form of the BROWN and BNC corpora to be processed easily.
- Improved the updating of the progress bar display, which may also improve the speed of processing in some cases.
- Improved the images used for icons within the program.

Bug Fixes

- Fixed bug that caused user defined token definitions containing special regular expression characters to not work properly
- Fixed bug that caused "Treat all data as lowercase" option to ignore the wordlist range and lemma lists
- Fixed bug that caused the lemma list "Load" button to not ignore the currently opened file if a new file dialog was opened and then "Cancel" was pressed
- Fixed bug that caused file searches to not work if the search entry box was blank.

3.2.0

This is a major upgrade with a completely redesigned interface, several new features, and several bug fixes. The new interface follows the basic design used in previous versions, although users should find it 'cleaner' and more intuitive. In particular, all global and tool menu settings have been combined into two groups, where all the related settings can be accessed and adjusted within the same window. This should dramatically improve the usability. All tools now have access to the search engine (including the **Word List Tool** and **Keyword List Tool**) and there is also a new advanced search window that can be used to perform list (file) searches, and searches within a particular context. Due to the nature of the changes, this version will not be compatible with the settings files for previous versions. Another huge change is that this version will run on Macintosh OS X systems.

New Features

- Completely redesigned interface
- Added search and advanced search features to all tools (including the **Word List Tool** and **Keyword List Tool**).
- Created new list (file) search available in all tools.
- Created new context search option in all tools except the **Word List Tool** and **Keyword List Tool** where it has no meaning.
- Busy cursors are used to indicate when very long sorting operations are being carried out (e.g., when sorting large N-gram list results).

- Case options affecting whether or not data is converted to lower case are now more intuitive. For example, the 'Case' option in the main window now only affects the operation of the search itself and has no impact on the data under observation. Data can be treated as lowercase (for example in Word list tool) by choosing the 'Treat all data as lowercase' under the appropriate category in the 'Tool Preferences' menu.
- The number of corpus files (and reference corpus files) being analyzed is now displayed.
- Corrected some mistakes in this readme file
- My name has been removed from the top of the main window! However, please remember that my name is Laurence with a U if you are ever citing me in your research papers!!
- Now works with Macintosh OSX

Bug Fixes

- The program no longer crashes when the 'All Values' option is chosen as the threshold value in Key-words.
- Negative keywords are now highlighted correctly when the 'Show Negative Keywords' option is selected.
- The KWIC lines are now aligned correctly even when the hit appears near the very start or end of a file.
- Collocates frequency values are now correctly calculated even when the span extends further left than the start of the file
- The action of the 'one word only' wildcard is now more intuitive.
- Some operations (e.g., creating a word list) now do not crash after restoring the default settings and then performing an operation.

Bug fixes (since beta1 version):

- The program now (correctly) only shows files that generate hits in the Concordance Plot tool.
- The sort function in the Keywords Tool now works correctly. In previous versions, even when the 'Frequency' option was selected, the sort would be based on Keyness. Also, in some cases inverted sorting did not work.

Bug fixes (since beta2 version):

- The program now (correctly) hides the various Concordance Tool panes depending on the chosen Display Options. In the earlier beta versions, the options were ignored.
- The default file type to use when opening directories now works correctly. In previous beta versions, after hitting the apply button, the default file type reverted back to the .txt type.
- Fixed a bug that prevented the n-grams option in the Clusters Tool from working when the search term entry box was empty.

Bug fixes (since beta3 version):

- Fixed bug that caused the program to not be able to open files with non-English names correctly if the full-pathname option was selected. There are potentially many problems with non-English filenames, so I recommend that users use English filenames for their corpus files, and also save them under a pathname which only contains English characters.
- Fixed bug that caused the 'OR' wildcard to not work correctly if a character other than '|' was user defined.

New Features (since beta4 version):

- Made some small changes so that the program could be more easily ported to Macintosh and Linux platforms.

3.1.303

This is a very minor upgrade with just one change:

Bug Fixes

- Corrected problem that caused the No. of Hits to not be indicated correctly in the Concordance Plot Tool display when more than one corpus file was being used.

3.1.302

This is a very minor upgrade with the following changes:

Bug Fixes

- Corrected problem which caused the program to not launch when the path of the default temporary folder on the system contained non-English characters.
- (Linux only): Corrected problem that caused the Open Dir menu option to not work correctly.
- (Linux only): Corrected problem that caused font selections to not work correctly.

New Features: Improved speed and memory handling when calculating collocates. Over ten times faster than in previous versions (including version 3.1.3).

3.1.3

This is a minor upgrade containing an important bug fix that prevented files with non-ASCII filenames being used. There are also some major performance improvements. For example, n-grams will now be processed over ten times faster on small corpora and many more times faster on larger corpora. A list of all important changes is below:

New Features

The history feature for search term entries has been changed. I have heard two reports of the 3.1.2 version not starting on computers. Hopefully, this change will allow the program to start correctly on all machines.

The performance of tools such as Collocates, Clusters and N-grams, has been significantly improved. (Over ten times faster on small corpora and many more times faster on larger corpora.)

The Open Dir option now opens files in all sub-directories too.

The program will automatically look for a user defined settings file named "antconc_settings.ant" in the directory where the program is saved. If this file is found, this settings file will be used instead of the default settings. Also, a splash window will be displayed when a user settings file is found. If no file is found, the default settings will be used. In this case, no splash file will be shown. This feature allows users to save their setting preferences and use them again without having to load the preferences each time.

Bug Fixes

- Files with non-ASCII file names were incorrectly processed preventing them being used. Introduced in version 3.1.2. Fixed.

- In the N-grams tool, non-word units (e.g., spaces) at the beginnings of lines were treated as words. This caused some n-grams of n-1 size to also appear in the results list. Fixed
- When "ALL" was selected as the file type option in Open Dir, sub-directories were also displayed even though these could not be opened or processed. Fixed
- In some tools, non-ASCII filenames were sometimes displayed incorrectly, even after the correct encoding was chosen. Fixed.
- If 'Exit' was chosen from the File menu options, the program exited without a warning. Fixed.
- The "Add" button for the 'Add Word' option was accidentally deleted from the Word List Preferences menu. This meant that words could only be added by hitting the return button. Fixed.

Changes

- The default file type for Open Dir has been changed to .txt
- The 'Directory' displays in both the main window and keywords list preferences window have been deleted. As directories and sub-directories can now be used, this feature has become redundant and perhaps confusing.

3.1.2

This is a semi-major upgrade containing a new Lemma List tool, and numerous bug fixes and interface improvements. A list of all major changes is below:

- Binding to plot canvas lines to allow jumping to hit in file (same as in concordance view).
- Binding to file list allowing the user to simply click on the file name when using the File View tool to view the file
- History feature for all entries (use up and down arrows on keyboard)
- Much faster concordancer processing (especially sorting... up to ten times faster)
- Ability to clear content of tools (Clear Tool, Clear All Tools, Clear All Tools and Files)
- Ability to save list of all loaded files in settings file
- Redesigned "one or more words" and "any one word" wildcards to act more sensibly. Now, the wildcards incorporate any non-tokens between possible words. Therefore, use "is#dog" and "is@@dog" etc. to search for the hit "is a dog" in the sentence "This is a dog."
- New Lemma tool allowing all lemmas of a word list word to be displayed. Note: A lemma list is required.
- Added bindings to Wordlist Range list to allow words to be deleted (button) or kept (button) as with other tools.
- Swap button to switch the main and reference corpora when doing keyword analyses. (Accessible from the Keyword preferences menu).
- Fixed serious bug that caused the program to freeze or crash when an incorrectly formed regular expression was used as a search term.
- Fixed serious bug that caused some word, keyword, and font encodings to not be loaded correctly from the user settings files
- Fixed bug that caused the 'Reset' buttons to not work correctly.
- Fixed bug that caused 'user defined token definitions' to not be loaded correctly.

3.1.1

This is a minor upgrade although it contains a new T-Score stats feature, and has a new editing feature, allowing you to select and then delete, or keep certain results lines. A list of all major changes is below:

- Added T-Score to stats measure in the Collocates Tool.
- Changes the Collocates Tool menu to allow one of several statistical measures to be chosen.
- Adding a feature so that any selected results lines can be either deleted or kept (after deleting all others).
- The tag settings options in the File Settings menu have now been moved to a separate menu.
- Labels in the software (in particular those related to language encodings) have been slightly altered to make them clearer.
- Improved the warnings given when the Collocates Tool is not in sync with the Word List Tool, during the calculation of collocate significance.
- Changed the internal workings to allow LINUX and WINDOWS ports of *AntConc* to be easily created from the same source code. This should allow future versions to be released at the same time for both operating systems.
- Fixed a bug that caused the Transition probabilities calculation to not initialize correctly. This meant that although the first calculation was correct, all later calculations would be given false measurements.

3.1

AntConc 3.1 is a major, major upgrade. I was very tempted to name this *AntConc* 4.0, but in the end chose to keep it in the 3s. To list the improvements and changes will take up many pages, so only the major differences are listed here in no particular order. Of course, with so many changes, there will inevitably be new bugs that have crept into the program. However, I hope you will find that this release is an improvement over previous releases.

- Implementation of new Collocates Tool.
- Total reworking of the programming underneath all tools for performance enhancements.
- Adding of "sort" features to many tools, enabling quick and efficient re-ordering of results information.
- Sensible treatment of word case in all tools. Now searches are truly case sensitive or insensitive, and results can be displayed according to the case setting.
- All settings can now be imported or exported to a file. This allows users to easily upload their preferred settings, avoiding the need to constantly make changes to the defaults. This is a HUGE improvement (I think!).
- The "Open Dir" option has been restored. File types that will be read into *AntConc* via the "Open Dir" option can now be specified in the "File Settings" menu.
- *AntConc* is now FULLY Unicode compliant. It should work with any language in the world. I am very interested to hear how *AntConc* works in different languages. Please let me know. Token definitions can be made using all Unicode character classes, or a user defined token definition can be made. However, I would advise against using the user defined token definition, as it is so easy to overlook possible characters that might need to be processed.
- As *AntConc* is now fully Unicode compliant, all possible encodings of characters are listed under the Encodings menu option. For English and all other Western Language, the default option, iso-8859-1 should work fine. Note that many Windows systems actually save files in the cp-1252 encoding which resembles iso-8859-1 but is a little different, just to confuse people! Users with Japanese texts will probably find shifts to be the best option.
- Some users have said they could not open the font selection windows. This problem has been fixed.

- Many new ordering options have been added, for example, from word ends.
- The overall design of the interface has been improved, allowing for new options to be easily added without cluttering the display. Also, most menu options now use simple checkboxes instead of the confusing “yes”, “no” radio boxes used in previous versions.
- Some of the tool names have been changed. In particular “lexical bundles” are now called “N-Grams”, which is a more familiar term.
- The Word Stems feature has been removed. This only worked with English texts, and the results were of questionable value. If a user would like to see the feature in a future version, please let me know.
- The size of the program has increased by around 1MB. This is so that all the fonts and encodings for true internationalization of *AntConc* can be included.
- This read me file has been largely rewritten. I hope there are fewer spelling mistakes this time!
- Many, many small bugs have been fixed, mainly related to the way the interface responded to user actions.

3.0.1

A few bugs in 3.0 have been corrected. Also, the View Files tool has been redesigned to work much, much faster. To do this, the program now does no processing at the end of lines. Therefore, ambiguous line endings will stay ambiguous!

- Improved performance of View Files tool
- Corrected bug which caused the first file in Keywords to appear even after the list of files is deleted from the system.
- Added feature to allow files to be added to the system from different folders. Now, if a file is opened into the system, it will be added to the current list without deleting the previous list files. The same applied to files added in the Keywords List preference menu.

3.0

There have been so many changes that it is almost impossible to list them. Here are some of the more obvious differences between *AntConc*3.0 and previous versions.

- Wildcard implementation
- Word stem implementation
- Save current window feature added to all tools (except ‘Concordance Search Term Plot’)
- Three levels of sort implemented
- Complete redesign and implementation of the ‘View Files’ tool, making it generate results much faster. (But it is still too slow).
- Hyperlinks added to the results of all tools.
- Rearrangement of the menu options
- Redesign of the file list window, allowing one or more files to be closed.
- Redesign of the main results windows, placing information in different window ‘panes’. Each pane can be resized, or hidden.
- Redesign of the data selection methods. The selection methods now comply with most other software products.
- Complete redesign of many sub-routines enabling quicker processing.

- Many, many bugs found and corrected. Please tell me if you find a bug because I WILL correct it.

2.6.0

- Corrected a bug (introduced in version 2.5.3) which caused cluster lists to not be displayed alphabetically.
- Corrected a bug (introduced in version 2.5.3) that prevented the 2nd sort color to be properly updated from the Settings menu. Thanks to a user for pointing this out to me.
- Corrected a bug (introduced in version 2.5.3) that prevented files on a Japanese system to be open correctly. This bug is related to the new implementation of the Perl programming language. Please point out any bugs due to the new version of Perl, as they are very difficult for one person to discover.
- Added an option to either show or ignore tags embedded in files (which is useful when processing HTML or XML files).
- Added a 'lexical bundles' option to the Word Clusters tool that generates "word n-grams".
- Deleted the "Open Directory" option, as it prevented files other than .txt from being uploaded.
- Added menu setting options to allow the font for searches and results to be changed.
- Added menu setting options to show Japanese fonts (in SHIFT-JIS encoding) to be displayed properly.
- Reduced the overall size of the program by approx. 1 MB.
- A number of small bugs were corrected.

2.5.4

- Corrected a bug (introduced in version 2.5.3) which caused word lists and keyword lists to not be displayed alphabetically.

2.5.3

- Adjusted the positioning and size of application widgets so that the application will be displayed properly on an 800 x 600 or higher resolution monitor.
- Corrected several spelling errors in this read me file.
- Adjusted the parameter settings for the Word Clusters tool.
- Re-labeled several buttons so that they display properly on low resolution monitors.

2.5.2

- Enabled a new 'Clusters' tool, for generating word clusters centered on a target search term.
- Re-ordered Open File and Open Dir options in the File menu. I think file navigation combined with 'select all files' is easier than directory navigation,
- Fixed a couple of small, insignificant bugs.
- Fixed some spelling errors in this read me file.

2.5.1

- Enabled a new feature, whereby clicking on the search term hit in any concordance line, allows the user to view the hit in the original file via the View Files tool.
- Fixed a small bug in the View Files tool, which caused the searches to ignore the 'Case' setting.
- Improved the performance when generating View Files by caching already processed files

2.5.0

A fairly major upgrade since 2.4.1

Here is a list of changes that have been made

- Bug fix. When viewing files, and locating the next or previous hit, if the target file was changed and the hit number did not exist in the new file, the program would crash. This problem has been fixed.
- Extension: In the view file window, hits would only appear if they occurred on a single line in the original file. This would result in different numbers of hits depending on if the search was made in the concordance window or the view files window. The view file processing has been completely revised enabling view file searching to correspond exactly with that used in the concordance window. Unfortunately, this has resulted in a small loss in performance when generating the highlighting in the view file. Also, clicking in the View File window now allows the user to immediately jump to the nearest hit.
- The ability to show or not show full path names to files has been added as a system preference
- The ability to show or not show file names in the concordance window has been added as a system preference.
- The ability to set a wordlist 'range' has been added as a system preference.
- Highlighting in the View Files tool has been changed to make the hits easier to see.
- Pop-up windows that showed how many concordance hits were generated, and that reported when no hits were found have been removed. Instead, the status of the concordance hit processing is now shown in the top right of the main window.
- Many small bugs relating to how the various tool displays are updated after preference changes are made have been corrected.
- Processing that blocks user events (e.g., mouse clicks) have been reduced.
- The internal workings of the program have been re-written so that problems and future additions can be easily handled.
- The general layout of the README file has been re-designed.

2.4.1

New since *AntConc* 2.4.1 is the ability to choose whether or not to view 'Negative Keywords'. These are words in the target file that have an unusually 'low' frequency. In previous versions of *AntConc*, Negative Keywords were not distinguished from Keywords. However, now they are treated separately, and if the user chooses to display them, they appear after the Keywords, with a highlight color.

2.4.0

A major upgrade since 2.3.0

- First, progress indicators were added to 'pages' of *AntConc*.

- Second, a new file view feature was added to view target files in their original state.
- Third, a keyword generation feature has been added using log-likelihood and chi-squared methods.
- Finally, several bugs were found, in particular, bugs centered on the wordlist generation feature. This feature of the software should work much quicker now. Also, the user can interrupt the processing of files in any 'page' of the software.

2.3.0

A major upgrade since 2.2.3

- First, the ability to view concordance search results as a barcode plot graph and a feature to produce wordlist according to different criteria were added.
- Numerous bugs centered on the way the software entered a 'Busy' mode were corrected.
- The main core of the software was also updated resulting in a quicker, 'cleaner' processing of the data.
- Performance improvements should be noticed as a result.

- Updated file and directory selection dialog boxes to run smoothly in a Windows environment.
- Also, changed the default colors for sort highlighting, and search window frame size.
- A number of small bugs were also corrected
